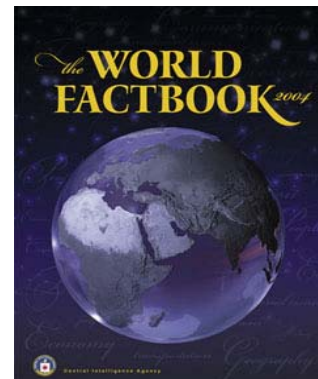
#### MAP CENTRAL
