CQ Researcher	Explores a single "hot" issue in the news in depth each week. Topics range from social and teen issues to environment, health, education and science and technology. Includes charts, graphs, articles, a pro-con feature, chronology and bibliographies. Research help guide
Opposing viewpoints	Full text periodicals, newspapers, journals, pamphlets, primary source documents and other sources of information on controversial topics. Arranged by topic. Research guide help
SIRS Researcher	Contains thousands of full-text articles exploring social, scientific, health, historic, business, economic, political and global issues. Research guide help
