



Bibliography Help

Bibme.org is a free online bibliography maker. You will need to **sign up for an account** (super quick and easy). Then:

1. Select your resource's format (website, book, magazine, newspaper, etc.). You may use auto-fill mode or manual mode to enter data about your resource. Enter the required text, and click "Add To My Bibliography".
2. Once you've added all of your resources, select **MLA** from the *Format* drop down box on the right hand side of the screen.
3. Click **Download** and your bibliography will open in a new Word document.
