Search for books

Find full-text articles in periodicals and library databases

COEL

A collection of databases available from COEL on various subjects. Includes: CQ Historic Document Series, CQ Politics in America, CQ Political Handbook of the World, CQ Researcher plus Archive, CQ Almanac, and CQ Weekly. Full text available.

Academic Search Elite (1/1/1984 -)

Multidisciplinary database covering social sciences, humanities, education, physical and life sciences, and ethnic studies. Over 3,500 journals are indexed. Some full text available.

EBSCO Collection

Select EBSCO Collection if you want to search more than 1 database at the same time. View the database descriptions, select the ones you want to search, and click on "Continue."

Newsbank Access World News (1/1/1991 -)

Indexes current issues and events from over 500 U.S. and world newspapers and wire services. Includes access to *The Oklahoman* and the *Tulsa World*. Full text available.
