Subscription Databases

Academic Search Premier (EBSCO): Full-text and citations of scholarly, peer-reviewed journals. Updated daily.

Global Issues in Context: Provides background information and explanations of the impact of global issues and events, including expert perspectives from cultural, religious, political, social, economic, and scientific & health standpoints. As a truly non-U.S.-centric resource with no "U.S. filters", **Global Issues** provides full-text access to international magazines, academic journals and news sources, primary source material, and interactive graphs, tables and charts.

JSTOR - Arts & Sciences I, II, III & IV: Full-text of scholarly journals (often from the first published issue). NOTE: The most recent issues (from 1 - 5 years) are typically not included in this database.

Lexis Nexis Academic: Full-text documents from news, business, legal, medical, and reference publications.

NewsBank: Electronic editions of local, regional U.S., & international newspapers.

[Washington Post](#) - Direct link to online version of newspaper (1977 to present).

[Wall Street Journal](#) - Link to ABSTRACTS only of the online newspaper (March 2004 to present).

Points of View (EBSCO): Essays that present multiple sides of current issues.

Project Muse: Full-text of humanities and social sciences journals from scholarly publishers.

The Digital Librarian: A librarian's choice of the best of the Web,

Catalog of U.S. Government Publications: The finding tool for electronic and print publications from the legislative, executive, and judicial branches of the U.S. government.

Globethics.net Library: This library provides users free access to full text versions of more than a million documents in the field of applied ethics. A wide variety of journals, encyclopedias, books, magazines, newspapers, dissertations and other documents can be accessed. The digital library on ethics was developed by Globethics.net, a global network organization with the objective of empowering people in all regions of the world to reflect and act on ethical issues. Individuals need to register (free of charge) as participants to access full-text.

GreenFILE: Free resource from EBSCO focuses on environmental information for individuals and corporations as well as environmental laws, regulations and studies. Scholarly and non-scholarly articles.

HighWire: Archive of free full-text articles; contains some pay-per-view also. If you can't find it anywhere else - look here.

Internet Public Library: An internet resource to assist with background research - pathfinders provide links to begin research on numerous topics, searching tools help make the job easier, and lots of links to librarian-researched websites provide a collection of valid resources and reference tools.

Librarians' Index to the Internet: This publicly-funded website includes the best of the Web with over 20,000 entries maintained by librarians and organized into main topics.

Occupational Outlook Handbook: For hundreds of different types of jobs, the Occupational Outlook Handbook tells you the training and education needed, earnings, expected job prospects, what workers do on the job, and working conditions. In addition, the Handbook gives you job search tips, links to information about the job market in each state, and more

ProCon: Promotes critical thinking, education, and informed citizenship by presenting controversial issues in a straightforward, nonpartisan, primarily pro-con format.

Smithsonian Institution Research: Links to nine research centers. Topics range from art to zoology.

USA.gov: Provides official information and services from the U.S. government. This site makes it easy for the public to get U.S. government information and services on the web. Includes a [tutorial](#) on getting government information.
