



Student Daily News	Get some updated headline articles here - none are very long. Also includes cartoons, quotes, other links.
National Geographic	A taste of our world's cultures, biodiversity, geography, and more.
Civilizations (or Civilisations)	An interactive tool using web technology "to reveal the sweep of historical forces and the rise and fall of great empires and ideas over 5000 years in a way that no book could ever do."
Eyewitness to History	Firsthand accounts of history, ringside seats for all kinds of events, from ancient times to now. Words of people who lived it, saw it, smelled it!!! Ick! (sometimes)
Metro Museum of Art	Excellent source of art for all sorts of time periods and all areas of the world! Exciting stuff!
Mesopotamia - Ziggurats!	No, not John Stewart's Mess-o-potamia from Comedy Central!! This web site focuses on the ancient land known as the Fertile Crescent. The civilizations here are Assyria, Babylonia, and Sumer (Sumer was where the Ziggurats were built -- besides our very own variation behind Juanita).
Seven Wonders of Ancient Greece	This video has many parts - this is but Part I posted on YouTube (about 10 min).
Roman Empire	Different sections to click on, including simplified/quick info called the "Kids' Section". Great pictures from a re-enactment near Hadrian's Wall also.
Decimation&Chariot Scene	This is taken from "The Fall of the Roman Empire" - about 5 min. video clip - see what is representative of Rome, what is exaggerated, what is not badly done for 1964 film-making! Good description provided also.
Byzantine Empire Video Clip	About 4.5 min video clip - you will notice some errors in English here - the person posting is from Germany. What does this video show you about the rise and fall of the empire, though?
Byzantine Empire Video	This video gives you a very (VERY) overall idea about the empire - 4 min. - from "How Stuff Works" - Civ in Conflict.
Sir Gawain and the Green Knight	This is Book 1 of Sir Gawain and the Green Knight. There is more to the story that you might want to read if you are intrigued.....
Illustrated Manuscripts	This web site gives you the potential to scroll through several illustrated manuscripts, some which show the Black Death.....Descriptions available.
Peasants-Serfs Video Clip	This satirical clip about government and society in Medieval Times was done by Monty Python (from "Monty Python and the Holy Grail"). What commentary are they making?
Black Death Video Clip	This "Bring out your dead" clip from "Monty Python and the Holy Grail" makes light of something that was actually quite horrific. How do they get some things right and some things wrong, based on what you know?
Dante's Inferno: Uh oh...Is this Hell?	A virtual tour of Dante's interpretation of Hell (Christianity). Dante's Inferno is a piece of literature that was written during Medieval Times (1308-1314) in Italy. This site has excellent artwork and quotes (somewhat gruesome at times), and a demonstration of the "levels" of Hell.
Humanism	An overall and very user-friendly look at this intellectual movement, using flash animation and key terms.
Leonardo	This is Leonardo's own museum! Well, OK, not his own museum, but when the Museum of Science had the Leonardo exhibit in 1997, this site captured some of the highlights. Ask yourself - was he a TRUE Renaissance Man (spectacular at everthing he did or tried) or something else?
Protestant Reformation Video Clip	About 8 min. from "How Stuff Works"
Enlightenment: Age of Reason	Video clip on the Enlightenment, Age of Reason, and Scientific Revolution.
Newton-Gravity-Comet	Clip reminding us that it was not the apple that helped Newton figure out about gravity!
French Revolution	This web site will offer you primary sources, images, maps, etc.
French Rev-Primary Sources	See which of these primary sources seem to give you the best idea of the TONE of this time period!
French Revolution-Use of Terror, 1794	This speech was given by Maximilien Robespierre in February of 1794, the same year he was killed (July).
French Rev Vintage Cartoons	Do a search on this site for the political cartoon you wish to find - what topic do you need? What issue or event?
French Rev Paintings	Jacques-Louis David exhibit at the Getty - these paintings can be considered primary sources since they are from the time period! He was considered "First Painter" - he painted for Napoleon.
"Shooting an Elephant"	This short story by George Orwell makes some powerful commentary about European imperialism of the late 1800s and early 1900s
"Self Help" 1882	An excerpt from a primary source document to give you an idea of the mindset in Victorian England in the 1800s.
Sudan-The Mahdiah	Scroll down on this web site until you find the link for "The Mahdiah, 1884-98" - this is our connection to "The Four Feathers" and our study of nationalism and imperialism. It will give you good background.
Novel-The Four Feathers, 1902	A nice summary of the novel and brief mentioning of how films may vary from the plot line in the novel that A.E.W. Mason wrote in 1902.
Causes of WWI	Info and a flow chart of WWI's long-term causes.
Pre-WWI Documents	Read primary documents from before the war - note the long-term causes by viewing these documents - what do you see?
WWI - "The Great War"	Poetry, maps, timeline, propaganda posters, primary source documents and more, all relating to The Great War (as it was called until there was a second large-scale conflict beginning in the 1930s -- you DO know the one to which I am referring?).
World War I	This site is hosted by the BBC in conjunction with a series they did on the war. There is no shortage of war information here, including an interesting multimedia zone.
The Great War	The site is maintained by PBS, initially created to accompany a 1996 series on TV. Now it has been expanded and updated to include audio recordings, interviews, and maps.
WWI Video: 1914-1918	This short video gives you an overview of "The Great War" in around 7 minutes (not bad, eh?).
WWI Photo Archive	Notice you can even see that Australia and New Zealand were involved in some major battles.
WWI Posters	What do these posters from The Great War tell you?
WWI Propaganda postcards	See which of these stand out to you! Notice the DETAIL!!
WWI Political Cartoons	Examine the cartoons of the time to see what insight it provides you -- questions are there to stimulate your thinking (as though that would be needed?).
Russian Rev Video Clip	This is a 4-minute video clip (Trueveo.com) that condenses the Russian Revolution - REALLY condenses it!

	Soviet Propaganda Posters	An interesting link to several posters used during the years of the Russian Revolution and former Soviet Union. These posters were used to persuade the public about ideas such as collectivization (farms), good hygiene, and literacy. The International Institute of Social History maintains this web site, which also includes posters from China and Cuba.
	Primary Sources: Years leading to WWII	Continue to scroll down if you are interested in a particular year - some of these links may not work - it depends on if this instructor is keeping all of these up to date (they are SO many!).
	Primary Sources: Ultrationalism	Here are some excerpts showing Germany and Japan's focus on nationalism as WWII loomed.....
	Totalitarianism in Europe: 1919-1939	This site will focus on Italy, Germany, and the Soviet Union (1919-1939). Info in text and video.
	Italian Fascism	This site will help you understand how Mussolini's Italy functioned when fascism was the order of the day.
	Mussolini speech: Video clip	This short speech was given in ENGLISH, 1929.
	Europe in the 1930s: Maps	Different maps to show how Europe changed in the 1930s, or "this site contains a number of specialized maps illustrating the complicated issues which contributed to the origin of World War II in 1939."
	Nazi Propaganda: Video (4min)	Examples of propaganda techniques used in the '30s and '40s by the Nazis - what they did and did NOT want you to see/perceive.....
	Nazi Propaganda#2: Video	This video uses Anti-Flag music that can be somewhat, shall we say, "edgy" - be aware of that if you go to this site.
	Hitler Youth	This web site explains how youth organizations were formed over time and were used by the government to maintain power in a fascist state.
	WWII Timeline	In addition to the timeline provided by this PBS web site, you will find info about battles, the psychology of war, and social aspects.
	Genocide - A Definition	Read this before beginning or getting too far into the Genocide Presentation Project.
	Holocaust Museum: Auschwitz Album	View this album that a Nazi SS officer kept - he was stationed at Auschwitz from 1944-1945. Learn the story behind how it came to be at the museum. Eerie.....
	Auschwitz 1940-1945	The camp system, Hitler's rise to power, orders, corruption, victims, maps, plans, etc.
	SSpielberg Film Archives- Holocaust	You can search for film clips surrounding WWII and the Holocaust. Film clips vary in length and topic.
	Stalingrad Memorial Video-5 min.	This video give you a sense of how the people of the Soviet Union (now Russia) have honored the fallen at the Battle of Stalingrad in the early 1940s (WWII).
	What is Communism?	A description of Communism and other political economy terms.
	So what was the Cold War, anyway?	A concise definition of the Cold War, what occurred, and how it ended. This web site offers links to other items of interest within the description (indicated by circle with an "i" in it) and is maintained by the History Channel.
	Timeline of the Nuclear Age	"The purpose of this timeline is to provide historical perspective, reminding us of where we have been in order that we may achieve a safer and saner future."
	Riddle of the Great Zimbabwe	"Could cattle wealth and trade alone have afforded the inhabitants of Great Zimbabwe a superior way of life, or was there something else, a political or religious ideology, that gave them a competitive edge over neighbors and enabled them to harness the manpower necessary for the construction of the site?"
	Ghosts of Rwanda	On the 10-year anniversary of the 1994 genocide in Rwanda, Frontline takes a close look at the issues then and now through video, interviews, analysis, examining the media, and many other avenues of exploration.
	Africa: the Cradle of Civilization	A project done for the "thinkquest" group. Lots of interactive stuff, historical information on all kinds of eras, languages, people, and more.
	African Voices	Done by the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History - it even has an interactive timeline!
	Wonders of the African World	"Join Henry Louis Gates, Jr. as he takes you on a journey to discover a wealth of African history and culture in Wonders of the African World."
	African Architecture	The Ivory Coast, Ghana, and Senegal are the featured areas on this web site.
	Equatorial Guinea	The U.S. State Department's profile on the African country of Equatorial Guinea.
	Sudan	Use this to explore the modern issues surrounding Sudan. Learn how far back this conflict actually goes and how much has been done in recent years to escalate it the proportions we see today. View UN documents and articles to increase your understanding of the complexity of these issues (Global Policy web site).
	Uganda	Examine the modern issues surrounding Uganda. Learn about the civil war in Uganda, one that has raged for two decades. Learn about the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA), an army which uses hundreds of children as fighters (Global Policy web site).

	Middle East-Global Connections	Timelines, overall themes, big-picture questions, video clips, images.
	Islamic Empire	This web site was set up to support a film that spanned over a thousand years of history, but is a wealth of information all by itself.
	"Misadventure in the Middle East": book & art	Henry Hemming and his buddy Al go to the Middle East in their car (named Yasmine) to paint their experiences and understanding of the people and culture of this region of the world. They are from England and have many interesting border crossings. It is 2003. The war in Iraq looms.  Iraq War Time Line 1979-2004	This time line was published by The Guardian.
 Iraq War Time Line 1993-2003 (& more)	About.com (Pierre Tristam) published this time line, giving you the ability to go back further if you want, hit the next part so you can find out what happened after 2003, and/or link to related issues.
 Iraq War Time Line 2001-2003	This time line is published by The Guardian.
 Iraq War Time Line 2001-2006	Cooperative Research History Commons published this time line. You can go back farther than 2001 if you want - I set it for that year to get you started on this link.
 Iraq War Time Line 1990-2008	U.S. Iraq War Pro-Con published this time line of events leading up to and into the Iraq War.
 Iraq War Time Line 2003-2009	ThinkProgress.org publishes this time line - it appears they update it as events unfold.
