Objective:

Present a side in a controversial subject through a recorded PowerPoint as part of a team.

Requirements.

Be assigned a team captain.

Team Captain writes subject and number from Pro Con Web site.

Each member reads:

- A. Pro Con Number Subject Assigned
- B. Reads Ben Franklin's Google Hit
- C. Writes THEIR OWN 1 Page front back essay.
- D. Comes back and makes slides as a team and records at least one slide for each team member (9 Slide minimum, 1 hidden with final answer).

1 sheet from each person detailing the issue

Draft Ben Franklin Decision Making Method. (Look his method up).

Turn that draft into a slide show with both sides represented

Record narrations

Team up with someone with a flash drive (School PC may not have enough memory). If possible purchase one. (\$6-7 at WalMart, Office Depot etc.)

As a team each voice must record at last one slide. The slide-show and your paper should have a PRO or CON Decision. The TEAM must have a FINAL HIDDEN SLIDE (DO NOT SHOW UNTIL TOLD TO SHOW AFTER A CLASS VOTE). with the TEAMS final pro-con statement (class votes in secret). Each student keeps a sheet, and then use

that sheet for another XLS project. The Team Leader will tally the class vote for their own projects.

Do not reveal your team answer until the vote, or being told to do so by the instructor.

Keep enthusiasm even if the number they drew for their subject is something they are not into. If all goes well, we can do another round the student picks (but that I approve of, since even on the PRo Con site, they don't have some subjects listed....).

Slide Show should include elements from our lessons and are graded accordingly.

Why Would You Use a Recorded Sound or Narration?

Two scenarios come immediately to mind.

1.If your PowerPoint presentation is set to play unattended at a business kiosk or at a trade show, you might want to add your own narration to the slides. This will have the effect of you being there to sell the product, or the presentation can be left running while you are busy with other prospective clients.

2.Sound effects can also be created using the recording feature. For example; If you are doing a demonstration or tutorial on fixing cars, it would be helpful to be able to reproduce the sound of that clanking noise, so students would know what to listen for.
