[Academic Search Complete](#) has citations and full text articles from peer-reviewed journals in social sciences, humanities, music, education, computer sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts & literature, medical sciences, ethnic studies, etc.

[AGRICOLA](#) (from EBSCO) "contains bibliographic records from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Library. Coverage for AGRICOLA dates back to 1970 and includes more than 2.5 million citations."

Anyone with an interest in environmental issues and who needs resource material regarding these subjects will find this database to be an invaluable tool.

Health and Psychosocial Instruments (HAPI) "provides ready access to information on measurement instruments (i.e., questionnaires, interview schedules, checklists, index measures, coding schemes/manuals ... vignettes/scenarios, tests) in the health fields, psychosocial sciences, organizational behavior, and library and information science."

Health and Wellness Resource Center searches "2,200 general interest health publications, over 400 health and medical journals," and several other health reference sources.

Infotrac **Health Reference Center**-Academic has a wide range of articles on health and medicine, many of which are full-text.

Health Source - Consumer Edition provides "information on many health topics including the medical sciences, food sciences and nutrition, childcare, sports medicine and general health; ... features searchable full text for nearly 150 journals, ... [and] is updated on a daily basis.

Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition "provides nearly 550 scholarly full text journals focusing on many medical disciplines, ... features abstracts and indexing for nearly 850 journals, ... [and] is updated on a daily basis.

HeritageQuest Online, which "provides libraries a unique, growing collection of research materials for tracing family history and American culture," includes complete U.S. federal Census, 1790--1930, obituaries, Freedman's Savings & Trust Company bank records, records on veterans of the American Revolution, and more.

HighWire Press "is one of the two largest archives of free full-text science on Earth ... assisting in the online publication of ... [hundreds of thousands of] free full-text articles."

Historical Abstracts is a "complete reference guide to the history of the world from 1450 to the present (excluding the United States and Canada, which are covered in *America: History and Life*)."

History Cooperative is a combined effort by The American Historical Association, the Organization of American Historians, the University of Illinois Press, and the National Academy Press to create this resource for historians on the Web, making the full text of current issues of the *American Historical Review* and the *Journal of American History* available electronically to members of the AHA and OAH and to institutions that subscribe to the print versions of these journals.

Humanities Full Text cites articles from scholarly journals and specialized magazines in the humanities, including archaeology, art, classical studies, communications, dance, film, folklore, gender studies, history, journalism, linguistics, social criticism, music, performing arts, philosophy, religion and theology. It also includes full text/full image articles.

Humanities International Index "provides cover-to-cover indexing and abstracting for over 1,700 journals . . . [including] a multitude of international journals, [plus] books and reference works. . . as well as original creative works including poems, fiction, photographs, paintings and illustrations."

Hoover's Online is a free subset of Hoover's business information.

[IIMP](#), the International Index to **Music** Periodicals, "covers nearly all aspects of the world of music, from the most scholarly studies to the latest crazes."

[IMSLP](#) stands for the International Music Score Library Project and "attempts to create a virtual library containing all public domain musical scores, as well as scores from composers who are willing to share their music with the world without charge."
